### VAC Pensions

It still amazes me how many veterans are unaware that they may be eligible for a pension! You may have had 3 weeks, or 30 years of service: it doesn't matter! If your disability can be tied to your service, it is likely that you are eligible for a pension.

The most common (and probably the easiest to obtain) is a pension for hearing loss and/or tinnitus. VAC is now recognizing lower body injuries (referred to as "Pain and Suffering") This covers anything from the feet to the hips, caused by whatever you did during your time with the CAF. There are other items that are pensionable as well. Another thing that most veterans don't realize, is that the amount of your pension is tied to the percentage attached to your disability. IE If you suffer from hearing loss, and your hearing decreases, your pension increases. Therefore, get your hearing checked regularly.

All disabilities may be reassessed every two years. Hearing aids are still supplied every four years. There are exceptions if the hearing loss is substantial, and a better hearing aid is needed.

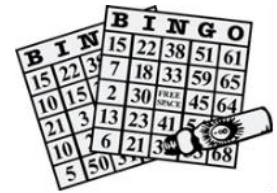
