First Vice President's Report

Province of Ontario COVID 19 Rules

As of September 22, 2021, Ontarians will need to be fully vaccinated (two doses plus 14 days) and provide their proof of vaccination along with photo ID to access certain public settings and facilities.

- Restaurants and bars (excluding outdoor patios, as well as delivery and takeout.) (When serving food or drinks, our Branch is considered to be functioning as a restaurant.)
- Meeting and event spaces, such as banquet halls and conference/convention centers. (This refers to our Hall and Lounge.)
- Facilities used for sports and fitness activities and personal fitness training, such as gyms, fitness and recreational facilities with the exception of youth recreational sport. (This refers to our Walking Club; Darts and Shooting Club.)
- Casinos, bingo halls and gaming establishments. (This refers to our Bingo.)

Individuals who cannot receive the vaccine due to medical exemptions will be permitted entry with a doctor's note until recognized medical exemptions can be integrated as part of a digital vaccine certificate.

For the period between September 22 and October 12, 2021, it is intended that people attending wedding or funeral receptions at meeting or event spaces will be able to provide a negative rapid antigen COVID-19 test from no more than 48 hours before the event as an alternative to proof of immunization. Individuals can provide proof of immunization by downloading or by printing their vaccine receipts from the provincial booking portal, or by calling the Provincial Vaccine Booking Line at 1-833-943-3900.

At the 08 September 2021 Branch 638 Executive meeting, the following motion was unanimously passed regarding providing a safe environment for our Executives, Members, Volunteers and Customers:

To ensure that our executive, volunteers, members and customers have a safe environment in which to work and socialize, all Branch executives, members and volunteers are hereby required to be fully vaccinated

before entering Branch 638, which includes our buildings, all its public rooms, kitchen, bar area, the office and activities taking place on our surrounding property as of September 22, 2021.

Understandably, there are those who fear needles, or don't believe in the efficacy of the doses being given or think that government mandated vaccination somehow interferes with their freedom of choice. They must realize however, that no one has yet come up with a cure for COVID 19 and COVID cases in hospitals are far higher with people who are unvaccinated so there are indications that the widely accepted, available vaccines are having a positive effect.

There must also be an understanding of those who have accepted the vaccinations and who wish to have some assurance of safety from those who don't believe there is some means of fighting the pandemic and insist on mixing everyone together.

Poppy Campaign

For the 2021 Poppy Campaign, Dominion Command is developing a series of initiatives to encourage greater participation in this important program. They will include:

Remembrance Island

This program was developed to get the attention of the younger generation and have them become more active in Remembrance Day. Remembrance Island is an educational based game using archival information from World War I, World War II, Korea and Afghanistan. There is no fighting or weapons, the goal is for the streamers/gamers to explore the land in actual three-dimensional scenes from the World Wars, Korea and Afghanistan, Normandy Beach, the trenches and see first-hand what it looked like from the veteran's point of view then and now. The players follow a path of poppy's interacting with each other and

gathering information until they reach the Vimy memorial where exploration stops and they pay their respects with 2 minutes of silence at the Memorial at 11:00 a.m. in real-life time, but actually 11:00 a.m. on the Island.

Tap And Pay Option

The Legion is exploring the tap and pay option for Poppy boxes thereby permitting electronic donations in a cashless society. The idea is to have a tap and pay option on our Poppy boxes and still maintain the cash option. The tap and pay is beneficial where there are unattended Poppy boxes in isolated locations. The tap & pay option will permit a donation using a credit card or phone.

Digital Poppy

The Royal Canadian Legion is embracing the digital age with a new virtual version of the symbolic Poppy. This new nationwide program will allow Canadians to make a monetary contribution online until Nov 11. In return, a digital two-sided Poppy will be sent to their email. A website walks you through the process and has an added element of personalizing the traditional Poppy pin. Your name is engraved on one side, and you can choose to create it in memory of someone else by adding their name on the other side.

Lest We Forget Moira A memorial stone will be dedicated to Tom Dick by his family. Here follows a tribute written by daughters Margaret and Rosemary.

Thomas Ritchie Dick, Lance Corporal, Royal Engineers, Allied Expeditionary Forces, WWII. That might have been his title from 1940 to 1945, but to his girls Margaret and Rosemary he was "Dad" and his girls were the apples of his eye. He was also Grandpa, GG Pa, brother, son, friend, mentor and boss.

Tom was a doer and a fixer. There was a year-long leak in the new Toronto City Hall causing considerable damage to floors, walls and carpets. Many contractors were called in, but no one could track this leak. Tom's company was called in and within a few weeks, Tom found it, had it sealed and the clean up could begin. He was McGyver before the TV show.

Family was everything to him. When his grandchildren were born, he couldn't have been more proud. Richard and Anne-Marie remember picnics at Fitzroy Provincial Park, eating bacon, eggs, beans and toast all cooked on a camp stove (even in the rain). Then soccer, playing catch or swimming to round it off. His great granddaughter Mayanna was the icing on the already beautiful cake. Holding her shortly after her birth always choked him up when he spoke about it.

However, the one title that meant the most to him for over 71 years was husband to Evelyn. It was clear to anyone who met them that theirs was the "real deal". Tom was from Glasgow, Scotland, and Evelyn was from Edinburgh (friendly competitors) but she never held that against him. They met at a talent show when Tom tried singing Danny Boy and Evelyn wondered who was trying to strangle a cat, at least that is how she described it. The rest is what we all dream about having and he continued to sing and play his harmonica for her. After 71 years his last words to her were "Evy I adore you".

Tom's rich 91 years included living life, not only with a soldier's heart but also as the epitome of a really "good man" to so many. He was so loved and he is missed every day, but his legacy lives on.

The following picture is of my cousin Raymond McKillen, Merchant Navy Veteran. Second right in photo. Ray was a member of our branch before he returned to England some years ago. At 85 he still plays trombone in the local concert band. As a young boy he played cello in the Ulster Youth Orchestra alongside the amazing flautist James Galway. Forsaking a career in music, Ray turned to physics and taught at Carleton for many years. We are all proud of Ray's wartime service.
