President's Report

This is our first CONTACT! for 2022 and things are starting to look much better as we see restrictions gradually lifting. We are financially in good shape and will soon be able to get out and about and move forward with our Branch activities.

Due to the pandemic restrictions, we have not been able to hold our 2020 or 2021 elections. Ontario Command now believes that as of 21st February 2022 we will be able to hold general meetings and elections at all levels of the Command keeping in line with regulations, policies and procedures as well as the Health Guidelines set by the province and the City of Ottawa.

It now looks like we will be able to get back to our regular meeting schedule with our first General meeting on 16th March and our General/Election meeting on 20th April 2022.

Nominations for the 2022/23 Branch 638 Executive elections are now open.

There are thirteen positions to be filled in the upcoming Branch elections: President, 1st Vice President, 2nd Vice President and 3rd Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, Sergeant-At-Arms, Padre and six more members elected as members of the Executive, but not to specific positions.

All Ordinary, Life, Associate, and Affiliate-Voting members in good standing have the right to vote and hold office subject to the following limitations:

- To be eligible to be elected President or Vice President a member must have served on the Executive for at least one term.
- A voting member, to be eligible for election to the Branch Executive Committee, is required to have been a member of the Branch for a period of one year prior to the date of the election.
- No member shall hold more than one elected Office in the Branch and the term of Office is for one year, (1st June 2022 to 31st May 2023).
- Nominations must include written acceptance by the Nominee in order to stand.

Nomination forms may be picked up at the branch office; however, call ahead to ensure it is open (613) 591-5570. For further information contact the Branch Elections Committee Chair, comrade Terry Jacobs, at (613) 612-0705.

I will therefore take a stance that will be very useful to the well-being of the Branch. During recent visits to the building, both Debby Holden and I have been approached about the state of cleanliness of the main areas used. Since this is not primarily my area of responsibility, I have spoken with Bob Thomson and George Royle to get their agreement to let me expound on this topic on their behalf since it is mainly their concern.

With more people showing up at the Branch on recognized duties, it has been pointed out that the cleanliness is suffering. A lot of salt and dirt is being tracked in and messing up the hallway and the carpet there, plus the main hall and the lounge floors. This is of course not surprising since minimal traffic has been the norm for some time and Bob and his stalwart cleaning gang have had a reduced mandate to clean on a regular basis. Now, during the very messy season of snow, ice, rain, slush, and the resulting salt crystals, gravel and mud, we will have to take extra care to maintain our

good image of neatness and tidiness in the eyes of our membership, visitors, and our paying clients.

Some of the considerations offered to help alleviate the problem are:

- Restrict entry to the main street door to preclude the trail of dirt created through the main hall from the back door to the rest of the building.
- During very inclement weather, strongly urge all users to bring indoor footwear to change into.
- Obtain a large, sturdy shoe cleaning mat for the front entrance (seasonal).
- Obtain boot trays to place under the coat racks; and
- Perhaps put up unobtrusive signage as a gentle reminder to everyone.

We would like to avoid higher cleaning costs or the use of unsightly plastic over-booties as seen in some commercial establishments. Any other suggestions would be welcomed.

Having the injury documented in your file helps. Often, the pain doesn't appear immediately. It can take years to manifest.

Pain and suffering also includes mental health.

Bursary Assistance Program 2022 by Christopher Braeuel

Do you have a child, grandchild or even a great-grand-child who will be attending post-secondary education? If so, he or she <u>may</u> qualify for a bursary from the Kanata Legion under the following eligibility criteria:

- Any person who is serving or who has honorably served in the Canadian Forces;
- 2. Merchant Navy personnel who are eligible for and who have been awarded campaign stars or decorations, and their dependents who are in need of assistance;
- 3. Ex-service personnel of commonwealth countries, other than Canada and of allied countries, resident in Canada:
- 4. Applicants who have graduated from or reside in the Kanata Area are given priority in the application process. Consideration is given to students who do not reside in the Kanata area, on the condition that funding is available; or
- 5. Applicant must have a relative that was or is a veteran.

The Bursary Program is designed to assist students entering or continuing their post-secondary education, including courses and programs of a technical and vocational nature, outside of and beyond secondary school. Approved bursary assistance is not based upon scholastic standing, but rather on the successful admission status to a post-secondary institution or successful completion of one or more years leading to a recognized degree, diploma or certificate.

APPLICATIONS MUST BE RETURNED TO THE LEGION NO LATER THAN June 1st, 2022, FOR THE UPCOMING ACADEMIC YEAR, SEPTEMBER TO AUGUST
