VOLUNTEERS NEEDED FOR FISH & CHIPS


As you are aware the Branch is totally run by volunteers.

Ladies' Auxiliary

I hope everyone had a good summer and with COVID19 restrictions having eased up and some optional, we can look forward to getting back to as close to the old normal we all so miss.

Over the summer months, the Ladies' Auxiliary continued to fulfill their mission by:

- Fundraising Hosting a very successful Trinkets and Treasures Sale, July 9th. A very special thanks to all those who donated items, came out to support our fundraiser and an extra special thanks to the Branch and L.A. volunteers as well as family members who all worked very hard. Your support is very much appreciated. When you support the Ladies' Auxiliary, you support the Kanata Branch and veterans.
- Catering The Ladies' Auxiliary catered to three outside catering jobs with one more before the end of September.
- Supporting Branch Functions volunteering at the annual President's Canada Day BBQ, Fish N Chips, Wednesday Coffee Club.
- Participating on the 2022 Poppy Campaign Planning Committee.

However, with time comes change and this year the Ladies' Auxiliary is no exception.

Due to family commitments, personal and/or health reasons, some members have had to either decrease their volunteer hours, modify or/and resign from various roles. Hence, it is time for the Ladies' Auxiliary to re-evaluate their fundraising activities, outside catering and internal catering services in conjunction with the skills and availability of members at the present time and is in progress.

In follow-up to the motion approved at the June 15th general meeting for the Branch to purchase a new sound system and the L.A. be requested to contribute from the sign funds raised towards the sound system purchase, upon receipt of the Branch request to transfer the sign funds, the L.A. requested the Branch to consider authorizing the formation of a committee to review the feasibility of an outdoor electronic/ digital sign before closure of the sign project. Although the bylaw states L.A. money is branch money, these funds were designated towards the purchase of an outdoor sign pending its feasibility and then the Branch's decision to approve or not approve the sign purchase; that it was advertised the funds were being raised for an outdoor electronic/digital sign and the L.A. worked diligently for four years raising funds both for the Branch and for the sign project, it justified a committee review. After many deliberations, Branch President, Bill, conceded that a sign committee be formed and that it would be comprised of only Ladies' Auxiliary members and allotted four weeks to submit a report.

The L.A. Sign Committee submitted a comprehensive and complete report by the August 22, 2022, deadline. The report listed its findings, considerations, and benefits of an outdoor electronic sign. Although the cost of an outdoor electronic sign is expensive, the report suggested ways and means to cover the costs i.e., apply for a grant. This report provided the branch with the information and considerations required to make an informed decision regarding the purchase of an outdoor electronic sign when the Branch chooses to do so.

The Branch Senior Officers reviewed the Sign report and concluded an outdoor digital sign is not feasible/viable. One reason is that the cost is too expensive; that the money could go towards projects with a higher priority. There was question based on the only location a sign is permitted whether passersby would see the sign and would have enough time to read the message/s. Branch Executive approved a motion to close the sign project. A \$10,000 cheque from the L.A. sign project savings account was presented by me on behalf of the Ladies' Auxiliary at the September 14th Branch Executive Committee meeting as the fifty per cent down payment towards the purchase of a new sound system. My request that the sign report be kept on file for future reference was agreed to by comrade Clay Wheaton, Acting Chair of the Branch Executive Committee Sept. 14th meeting.

Ontario Provincial Convention

Four of the Ladies' Auxiliary executive attended the Ladies' Auxiliary's 59th Ontario Provincial convention from September 11-13, held in Kingston, Ontario. It was very informative, resolutions were approved or defeated, and it was an opportunity to meet other Ladies' Auxiliaries. With regard to the bylaw where it states L.A. money is branch money, we learned in addition to the compulsory donations, provincial convention attendance costs and per capita, there is one more exemption to that bylaw, and that is when the Ladies' Auxiliary fundraises for a special project approved by the Branch and the special project was/is advertised to the public, the funds raised can only go towards that project pending project approval by the Branch.

Our L.A. placed third in the Ontario recruitment/ membership competition having recruited 22 new members from September 2018 to May 2022. The L.A. that placed first recruited 27 new members.



Happy 100th Birthday to Mary Egan

Thanks to comrade Jane Cane for submitting information about Mary's military background, written by her husband, veteran Bill Egan. Both Mary and Bill are members of the Kanada Legion and reside in their home in Kanata.



Mary Dorothy MacKinnon was born on September 8, 1922, on a farm located on the shores of Lake Ainslie on Cape Breton Island, as were her siblings - five sisters and two brothers. Mary, along with two of her sisters, joined the Canadian Women's Army Corps on September 13, 1942. She was sent to Kitchener, Ontario, for Basic Training and eventually was trained as a Teletype Operator, a trade she excelled in. Sometime later, some women came from England to interview selected CWAC members to choose those who would be considered most capable of adapting to the life they would encounter in England. Mary was chosen and then sent back to Kitchener for orientation and to prepare for travel.

Mary recalls that a fairly large number of the women who were chosen were sent to Debert, N.S. to be transferred to ships. She also recalls that they were held in Debert for some time because D-Day had just taken place and all available ships were being used for the invasion. Finally, some ships became available and the CWACs were on their way across the Atlantic. They spent several days, after arriving in England, in a camp on Salisbury Plain while they received more training. Mary was posted to Canadian Military HQ in London on Trafalgar Square where she served until March 8, 1945.

For her services, Mary was awarded the Canadian Volunteer Service Medal, with Clasp, the War Medal, and the Defence of Britain medal.

When Mary returned to Canada, she was employed in her trade with a position in the R.C. Signal Corps in Halifax. She continued from there at other postings in Kingston, Ontario, until she retired to raise our three sons.
