Kanata Remembrance Day Ceremony, Parade and Reception Committee Report

The 2022 Kanata Remembrance Day Ceremony, Parade and Reception were each a big success. This was the first time in over two years that hosting a full-scale Remembrance Day Ceremony with a parade was possible since the beginning of the pandemic in March 2020. Due to many parade participants finding the parade route from the Earl of March Secondary School to the Cenotaph challenging, a shorter parade route was suggested, starting and ending in the parking lot of the Russian Orthodox Church of the Blessed St. Xenis. It is with much appreciation to Father Oleg for granting use of the parking lot on Remembrance Day. An estimated 1,000-1,500 people were present at the Kanata Legion's 24th Remembrance Day Parade and Ceremony to "Remember." There was a good representation including military, politicians, veterans, cadets, scouts, cubs, brownies, guides, service groups, first responders, businesses, schools, particularly the Elisabeth Bruyere School with 52 students in attendance and the public.

The Canadian Showtime Chorus were not available to sing the two anthems at this year's Kanata Remembrance Day Ceremony due to a previous commitment. However, the
