#### Early Bird Campaign Membership Annual Renewal Reminder

The Early Bird Campaign is an opportunity for Kanata Branch 638 members to renew their annual membership dues at a reduced rate. The Campaign runs from 01 September to 30 November annually. During the Campaign, the annual membership fee is reduced from \$60 to \$55.

Payment may be made using cash, cheque, debit, Electronic Funds Transfer (EFT) and online.

- **Cash payment** may be dropped off at the Legion using the mail slot located near the main doors or at the office or the bar (when open).
- Cheques may also be dropped off at the Branch mail slot, at the office or at the Bar (when open). Please make cheques out to the RCL Kanata Branch 638 and ensure you indicate "Membership" on the cheque memo line.
- Debit payment may be made using one of the Branch 638 Point of Sale debit devices. Please ensure you write your name on the back of the debit slip and indicate membership.
- **Electronic Transfer Funds** payment may be made to <a href="mailto:membershipbr638@gmail.com">membershipbr638@gmail.com</a>. Please ensure you indicate the member or members renewing in the ETF Subject Line. Passwords are not required.

Online renewal may be made through **legion.ca** using the Members Section. You may have to register to make online payments. Members may also pre-pay if they so wish.

Upon receipt of annual dues payment, it will take approximately one week to process. Your renewal stickers will then be ready to be picked up at the office or the Bar (when open). Keep in mind that all office staff are volunteers and are not always in the office if you drop by.

If you are unable to pick up your card(s), kindly provide a self-addressed envelope with postage and your renewal stickers will be mailed out to you.

Digital card holders will be updated electronically by Dominion Command.

Lastly, if your personal information has changed, please forward the changed information to the Branch office so your files can be updated.

- December 2nd L.A.'s annual Vendor Extravaganza Sale with a L.A. baked goods table. More details coming soon.


