#### Poppy Campaign

The Poppy Campaign proved very successful in 2023. This was due to the dedication of the Poppy Campaign volunteers who worked long hours and numerous shifts for 10 days. Area Supervisors and Table Captains ensured table locations were staffed and well supplied with Poppy supplies. They also liaised and coordinated with those business owners, managers and staff who agreed to accept Poppy boxes on their premises. Indeed, personal visits were key to the success of the Campaign.

Following Remembrance Day, the cash counting team took several days to count all donations carefully and methodically. On the first day of counting, the Poppy Chair learned very quickly that he shouldn't get in the way of the cash counters as they tended to throw empty Poppy boxes in piles on the other side of the room. Those boxes may be small, but they hurt. He also learned to arrive with donuts as they tended to make the cash counters less grumpy and more tolerant of the interloper!

Once the Poppy Campaign concluded, there remained much behind the scenes work to be done in the way of financial and administrative imperatives. Detailed and complicated reports with tight timelines were required by Zone, District and Ontario Command. Many thanks to the Treasurer, Nila Bronkhorst, and to the Poppy Trust Chair, George Pollock, who dedicated themselves to complete and send these reports.

What now needs to be done is the public acknowledgement and recognition of those volunteers, businesses and donors who contributed to the success of the Kanata Poppy Campaign. - Ex-Service personnel or currently serving members of The Canadian Forces (Regular, Reserve & Merchant Navy) and their children and grandchildren
- Commonwealth war veterans & their children and grandchildren
- Ordinary and Life Members of The Royal Canadian Legion - children and grandchildren

## The Royal Canadian Legion Kanata Branch 638 Awards Descriptions and Criteria – 2023-24

### (Nominations for any of the first four awards listed below are due by 22 April 2024)

Certificate of Appreciation – Awarded to Legion members for services provided to the Legion and to outside Legion supporters who provide branch support in various areas. Could be possible every 2 years.

Certificate of Merit – Awarded to Legion members who, having received 1 Certificate of Appreciation, provide service above and beyond what is expected; demonstrate leadership in their volunteer position; and, for service, although short in duration, has a high order that deserves recognition.

Branch Service Medal – Presented to those with at least 5 years of service and 3 significant volunteer tasks demonstrating a significant level of service to the Branch which can be outside of or prior to any Executive position.

Legionnaire of the Year Award – Presented to a member who has made an outstanding contribution to the branch in that Legion year.

### {Nominations for any of the three awards listed below are due by 07 Feb. 2024}

Please note: Comrade Dennis Hearn, Membership can confirm a potential nominee's length of service before an award nominator proceeds with an award submission.

Life Membership - Awarded to any Ordinary, Associate or Affiliate Voting member for significant, outstanding and with 10 years continuous service and approved by Provincial Command. When granted, the Branch is recognizing a member's outstanding service and devotion to the Purposes and Objectives of the Legion.

Meritorious Service Medal (MSM) – Approved, only once, by the Dominion Command Ritual and Awards Committee considering the nominee's outstanding continuous service of at least 15 years of service. The nominee must be active in Legion events, must act as a mentor for new members and must hold or have held an executive position.

Palm Leaf – Approved, only once, by the Dominion Command Ritual and Awards Committee, for a member who has previously been awarded the MSM and who has performed further outstanding services to the Legion.
