Poppy Campaign Report

Although the 2023 Poppy Campaign is now behind us, we must now plan for the 2024 Poppy Campaign, as experience tells us that it is never too early to start. Most members are probably not aware, but the annual planning and preparation for the Poppy Campaign is complex and complicated. The largest issue for the Campaign is that of insufficient volunteers. Without volunteers, the Campaign simply could not happen. In the 2023 Poppy Campaign we were fortunate to have dedicated volunteers. However, volunteers came close to burn out due to long shift hours and a lack of volunteer staff. Nevertheless, the Poppy Campaign volunteer team accepted all challenges and conquered them. Therefore, the 2024 Poppy Campaign team will address the volunteer issues and focus on acquiring sufficient volunteer numbers.

In 2023, volunteers were attracted and recruited from Branch members, the Branch Ladies' Auxiliary, friends of the Legion, Branch 638 Bursary Award recipients and their families and three of our four sponsored cadet units. Area and Table Captains also used personal ingenuity to ensure most locations were staffed. Since all members, on their membership applications, agreed to participate/volunteer on annual Poppy Campaigns, the Planning Committee will appeal for volunteers early in the 2024 Campaign. Hopefully, more members will volunteer if they are able to do so.

As a result of the 2023 Poppy Campaign, volunteers collected donations in the amount of \$137,087.57 which was promptly deposited into the Branch Poppy Fund.

Thank you to all volunteers whether they be planners, Area supervisors, Table Captains, administrators, financial personnel, cash counters, drivers, Poppy Box collectors, individual members, friends, families, Cadets and Bursary Award recipients. Security Officer Report Improper Legion Hall Entry

I would like to remind everyone to be careful when entering the Legion. There are some 44 keys out there.

If your key lets you in the front door, it will also allow you to enter by any of the outside doors. We make a good amount of money from outside rental groups. These groups are entitled to privacy and uninterrupted meetings.

The back door is a loading zone and emergency exit. If you decide that you are going to enter by the back door, PLEASE make sure the hall is not in use. The same when entering the hall by the inside handicap door. If the door is closed. Make sure before you push the handicap button that the hall is not in use. It can be very disruptive to a group in the hall.

If this continues, one solution is to disconnect the outside back door entry locks. People would have to enter by the front doors to open the back doors.

Kanata Legion Bursary Assistance Program 2024 June 1st Deadline

Open to students of:

- Ex-Service personnel or currently serving members of The Canadian Forces (Regular, Reserve & Merchant Navy) and their children and grandchildren
- Commonwealth war veterans & their children and grandchildren
- Ordinary and Life Members of The Royal Canadian Legion - children and grandchildren

Applicants who have graduated from or reside in the Kanata Area are given priority in the application process. Consideration is given to students who do not reside in the Kanata area, on the condition that funding is available.



The Bursary Program is designed to assist students entering or continuing their post-secondary education, including courses and programs of a technical and vocational nature, outside of and beyond secondary school. Approved bursary assistance is not based upon scholastic

standing but rather on the successful admission status to a post-secondary institution or successful completion of one or more years leading to a recognized degree, diploma or certificate.
